Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The St. Andrew's cross symbolizes the unit's affiliation with the National Guard. The Minute Man also represents the proud history of the National Guard.
