EMBLEM



On a gray disc within a black border, originating in the viewer's upper right and extending diagonally towards the viewer's lower left is a red lightning flash between two shorter red flashes surmounted diagonally by a blue band with a pattern of fourteen white stars, overall a stylized white missile in vertical center, outlined black. Below the disc a red scroll edged black and inscribed "Procule Praevalemus" in white capital letters. **SIGNIFICANCE** The significance of the emblem and its motto are as follows. The SAC stripe is significant of SAC's deterrent mission. The use of seven stars of varying size on either side of the emblematic missile indicates relationship of the GAM-77 missiles to the basic striking power of the aircraft. The border of black and background of gray are this organization's selected squadron colors. (Approved, 13 Dec 1963)
