## **OPERATIONS**

The 311th and 312th Ferrying Squadrons were soon known as radio training schools, training over half of the operators, ground and aerial, for the whole group.

Major Carroll's 312<sup>th</sup> Ferrying Squadron transported over 1,600,000 pounds during the month, and the 325th Ferrying Squadron in moving from North Holt to Grove cancelled no regular runs nor delayed the regular passenger schedule.

The 312th Ferrying Squadron carried over 1,500,000 pounds of cargo 3800 evacuees and 1700 passengers.

The 312th Ferrying Squadron developed its maintenance section to such a degree of proficiency that an engine change was made in eighteen hours, the aircraft never being carried as "U/S. Three aircraft of the squadron were fired on by flak batteries of the German Luftwaffe, causing minor damages. Flying seventeen aircraft, the squadron totaled over 2,500 hours for the month, averaging 150 hours on each transport.
