# **341 LOGISTICS READINESS SQUADRON**



### **MISSION**

The 341 Logistics Readiness Squadron is responsible for supporting vehicle and transportation needs for the wing and its 23,500-square mile missile complex. The squadron consists of the Vehicle Operations Flight, Vehicle Management Flight, Transportation Management Flight, Installation Readiness Flight and Material Management flight which provides contractor operated supply/fuels services to enhance Team Malmstrom's combat readiness of personnel and equipment. The flights also support 21 tenant units in two states, as well as the largest geographic traffic management area in the Department of Defense. They control more than \$48.8 million in assets including more than 802 vehicles and an annual operating budget in excess of \$2.7 million. Their overall mission is to maintain a high state of mobility readiness.

### **EMBLEM**

On a disc Azure, an isosceles triangle entrailed Or and conjoined at the corners by three mullets one and two Argent, debruised at base by a terrestrial globe issuing from base Proper. Overall, an American bald eagle rising wings elevated and displayed Proper, all within a narrow border Blue. Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "SERVIRE OMNI MUNDO" in Blue letters. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "341ST LOGISTICS READINESS SQ" in Blue letters. SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The three stars represent the three logistics disciplines within the Squadron: transportation, supply and logistics planning. The globe symbolizes the worldwide mission of the Squadron. The eagle indicates wisdom, bravery and alertness.
