347th Civil Engineer Squadron Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The Falcon embodies air power, the heart of the Air Force mission. The arm and gauntlet represent the steadfast service provided by the squadron in support of air power and the Air Force mission. The leather perch signifies the necessary support structures provided by the engineering expertise of the unit. The gauntlet grasps three lightning bolt flashes signifying the personnel, equipment, and natural resources utilized by the squadron in fulfilling its mission.
