## **EMBLEM**



On a disc Sable, a pair of gloved hands, fingers downwards Argent, presenting an American flag folded in a triangle point to chief showing only the canton Azure, fimbriated White, bearing four mullets of the like, one and three, within a wreath formed of a laurel branch in dexter and an olive branch in sinister crossed at the stems Vert, all within a narrow Yellow border. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "349TH MEMORIAL AFFAIRS SQ" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "SERVICE WITH HONOR" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The background symbolizes mourning. The olive branch signifies peace, and the laurel branch stands for honor. The gloved hands reflect the personalized care taken in performance of duties. The folded flag indicates loyalty, devotion, bravery and justice. 5 Nov 2001
