EMBLEM

351 Missile Maintenance Squadron emblem: On a disc divided into a gray horizontal base and three vertical sections red, blue, and green fimbriated gold, each vertical section charged with a white vertical stylized missile, all within a narrow gold border. Below, a blue scroll edged gold.

SIGNIFICANCE: The emblem is symbolic of the squadron and its mission. The gray base represents the unit and its mission of support of the missile alert posture and the tactical squadrons assigned to their parent organization. The missiles refer the field in which the maintenance is performed and allude to the special skills required of personnel in the present complex deterrent force. The emblem bears the Air Force colors, golden yellow and ultramarine blue and the national colors, red, white and blue (Approved, 19 Apr 1965)
