OPERATIONS

Constituted in the Organized Reserve on 29 July 1921 as the 352nd Squadron (Observation), assigned to the XI Corps, and allotted to the First Corps Area. Initiated in April 1922 at New Haven, CT. Redesignated as the 352nd Observation Squadron on 25 January 1923. The 1st Flight relocated on 28 March 1923 to Hartford, CT. Assigned on 31 March 1924 to the 301st Observation Group (XI Corps). Consolidated on 24 November 1936 with the 352nd Aero Squadron (a WWI unit organized in March 1918 at Waco Field, TX; demobilized in January 1919 at Garden City, NY; reconstituted on 24 November 1936). Conducted summer training at Mitchel Field, NY. Withdrawn from the First Corps Area on 5 June 1936 and allotted to the Second Corps Area. Mitchel Field, NY, designated as headquarters on reorganization, but the unit was never organized at that location. Withdrawn from the Organized Reserve on 1 January 1938 and allotted to the Regular Army.
