

375th COMMUNICATIONS SQUADRON

MISSION

The 375th Communications Squadron supports the 375th Airlift Wing in its global reach mission by providing communications capabilities and maintenance to USTRANSCOM, AMC, 18th AF, TACC, AFCA, three flying wings and 40 associate units on Scott. The communications squadron is comprised of three flights:

The Information Systems Flight directs and controls communications, computer and information management capabilities supporting the AMC mission on Scott. One of the most visible portions of SCB is the Consolidated Client Support Administrator Helpdesk. The Consolidated CSA Helpdesk provides level one technical support for Scott customers. When possible, the CSA Helpdesk remotely manages systems and does touch maintenance when required. The helpdesk is here to provide technical assistance ranging from account setup to hardware issues. The CSA helpdesk can be reached at 256-COMM, option 1, option 2.

The Transport Systems Flight maintains all air traffic control and landing systems, ground radio and base weather equipment, Military Strategic and Tactical Relay Satellite systems, secure communications systems, C2 circuits, base telephone switch and associated equipment, base telecommunications cable infrastructure and all NIPRnet and SIPRnet data networks. SCM provides base switchboard operations and land mobile radio and cellular telephone equipment management. The most familiar component of SCM is the Maintenance Operations Center. The MOC is the Scott POC for all telecommunications moves, adds and installs and provides assistance for voicemail, custom call routing and troubleshooting. To reach the telephone helpdesk, dial 256-COMM, option 4.

The TACC IT Operations Flight directs and controls communications and computer capabilities supporting the Tanker Airlift Control Center mission. SCT provides exclusive, 24-hour IT support for more than 1,000 customers in the TACC. Its Systems Support Helpdesk is the first look communications and computer support for TACC personnel and coordinates scheduled maintenance requests as it impacts the TACC mission. SCT Radio Operations provides 24-hour UHF SATCOM, Combat Tracker II and IG/Exercise support as well as basic telephone troubleshooting for TACC customers.
