#### EMBLEM

Azure, a double-headed wrench bendwise and lightning bolt in saltire throughout Or, surmounted by a globe of the first, with landmasses Gules, encircled by a cog Silver Gray, all within a diminished bordure Yellow. Attached below the shield, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "402D MAINTENANCE WING" in Blue letters. Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The wrench and lightning bolt depict the unit's maintenance support and expertise of Air Force weapon systems. The cog represents the manufacturing and industrial support capability to AFMC, MAJCOMs, other DOD Agencies as well as private industry. The globe represents the contribution that the unit makes by maintaining Air Force weapon systems for use in all parts of the world. **SIGNIFICANCE:** BLUE represents truth, justice, loyalty and the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations which will always be kept free by the support and bravery of the Wing. YELLOW represents the wisdom of our workforce providing maintenance from the ground to the air. BLACK signifies our prudent and sophisticated maintenance workforce. We are a diverse group capable of supporting the most complex maintenance tasks on new technology as well as aging technology. BROWN depicts our global presence and our intimate impact to the warfighter's mission. SILVER represents our clear conscience while supporting the noble causes of our warfighters Wrench and lightening bolt: depicts our expertise related to the complex maintenance, repair and overhaul workload on several Air Force weapon systems, as well as the development and maintenance of highly technical software and electronic warfare countermeasures. Cog: represents our manufacturing and industrial support capability to AFMC, MAJCOMs, other DoD agencies, and private industry. Globe: represents our global impact on the warfighters mission. We know our maintenance support and expertise affects warfighters around the world in all countries. The warfighter comes to us for maintenance, and when necessary, we go to them - anytime and anywhere. Approved on 25 May 2005.
