EMBLEM



On a disc Azure, a Griffin segreant Or, langued and clawed Gules overall with four lightning bolts emitting from the right paw of the second, a sword grasped by its left forepaw, all within a narrow border Black. Attached above the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "SUPPORT THE FIGHT" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "419TH LRS" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The Griffin rampant represents valor in the face of danger. Generosity, nobility and strength are other attributes that are reflected in the Squadron. The lightning bolts represent the military fortitude and magnanimity that the unit is ready to effect with clarity and force. The sword indicates the unit to a just and generous pursuit of honor and virtue in warlike deeds and further signifies the Squadron's military honor. (Approved, 16 Aug 2007)
