EMBLEM



On a disc Azure, a falcon stooping Argent, beaked and legged Or, eyed Sable, claws Silver Gray, claspings a sword point to dexter chief of the like, in base a demi-globe Celeste, gridlined Black, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "ANY TASK ANYPLACE ANYTIME" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "460TH SECURITY FORCES SQ" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The falcon represents force protection. The sword symbolizes the ability to neutralize and deter threats. The globe represents the global nature of mission support by security forces. (Approved, 25 Nov 2002)
