**EMBLEM**

On a light turquoise blue disc, a light brown caricatured, grinning, woodchuck, affronte, dressed in blue fatigues and cap, his left eye closed in a wink, only his head, arms, and chest visible from behind a range of gray mountains and between two white snow-capped peaks; his arms extended over the range to manipulate four (4) aircraft suspended from his fingers by black strings like marionettes; the woodchuck's teeth, eyeball and highlights on nose and pupil of eye white; outlines and details black throughout. Significance: Our emblem is symbolic of the squadron's primary mission. The woodchuck, supporting the aircraft, represents the maintenance activity in its support role for the wing assigned aircraft. The woodchuck's wink is symbolic of the confidence with which this squadron accepts its responsibilities. The fatigue clothes reflect the typical dress of squadron personnel. (Approved, 11 Dec 1958)
