On a shield azure (Air Force blue), in base a cross coupé gules (Old Glory red), winged or (Air Force yellow, detail of the first), between the wings in chief a rod of Aesculapius argent (White, shaded Or Significance. Paynes gray); the shield edged of the third. symbolizes our Air Force Medical mission. The blue field of the shield and the golden wings represent the Air Force. The red cross symbolizes alleviating of suffering in war or calamity. The silver rod entwined with a

serpent, the symbol of the God of Healing', Aesculapius, is representative of the Air Force Medical mission. The golden border indicates unity and service. Approved 27 Jul 1956; newest rendition (Approved, 18 Mar 1982)

Our emblem symbolized our Air Force Medical mission. The blue field of the shield and the golden wings represent the Air Force. The red cross symbolizes alleviating the suffering in war or calamity. The silver rod entwined with a serpent, the symbol of the God of healing, Aesculapius, is representative of the Air Force Medical mission. The golden border indicates unity and service.
