## **EMBLEM**

Per pale Medium Blue and Sable, a boomerang Gules, above the Zodiac symbol, Taurus Or, all within a diminished bordure of the like. Attached below the shield, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "635TH SUPPLY CHAIN OPERATIONS GROUP" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The Zodiac symbol, "Taurus," is below the boomerang figure representing an aircraft. This symbolizes that supply chain operations is a supporting foundation of airpower. The divided shield represents day and night. The emblem represents continuous and global supply chain command and control. (Approved, 26 Aug 2010)
