EMBLEM



Azure, in chief five stylized cloud formations argent above four arced contrails issuing from sinister and arced to dexter, of the last, each terminating below a flight symbol ascending bendwise sable fimbriated of the second, in dexter flank a sun radiant or surmounted by a mountain range fesswise throughout gray garnished of the third, supported by a land area in base or, overall an eagle poised in profile with wings elevated, (head, neck and tail feathers argent; body, wings and upper legs brown; beak, lower legs and claws or; all garnished sable) grasping a caduceus fesswise gray: all within a diminished bordure gold. The eagle represents the fighter aircraft stationed at Luke AFB. The eagle clutching the caduceus represents the fact that every time Luke's aircraft fly, they carry the support of the hospital. The mountains represent the terrain in Arizona over which the aircraft fly. (Approved, 21 Oct 1977)
