The 1822nd AACS Group was established at Randolph Air Force Base, Texas, on I September 1954, as the result of a reorganization of the Group's parent unit—the 1800th AACS Wing, Tinker AFB, Okla., to establish two additional AACS Groups to assist and keep pace with the Air Force

expansion program.

The function of the Group Headquarters is primarily command and administrative. Its subordinate units include 14 squadrons, 16 detachments and one Facility Checking Flight, located in Texas, Oklahoma, New Mexico, Louisiana, and Arkansas.

The 1822nd AACS Group installs, operates and maintains terminal air traffic control and navigational aids required for the Air Force all-weather flying mission and provides communications to meet the requirements of the Air Weather Service.

The major communications-electronics facilities operated by the 1822nd AACS Group are airdrome control towers and ground control approach.
