Furthermore, the squadron provides military and travel pay support, accounting liaison and financial analysis services to all Aviano Air Base and associated units to include geographically separated units located throughout the Mediterranean region. Being the only squadron that works directly for the wing commander, the 31st Comptroller Squadron is also matrixed as the lead wing staff agency; handling administrative duties, and long range planning.

31<sup>st</sup> Comptroller Squadron emblem: Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of AF operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of AF personnel. The sword and wings reflect the unit's support to its parent wing and its mission to defend the peace through air power.
