## **OPERATIONS**

The objective during 1978 was to continue intensive training in assigned career fields, i.e.. Packaging and Preservation, Inventory Management and Material Facilities. A Mobilization Exercise was conducted during the May UTA. Personnel from the 94th TAW conducted the processing with assistance from the 34th Supply and Maintenance Squadrons. The exercise was considered a success.

The 34th Supply Squadron in conjunction with the 34th Maintenance Squadron participated in an on-going Community Relations Project. Personnel assigned to each squadron save newspapers,

magazines, etc. and bring them to each UTA. The newspapers are then bundled and delivered to the Happy Hour School for Exceptional Children. The average dollar value of papers turned in is approximately \$50.00. a month to the school.

In September three units of the wing at Robins AFB, GA were programmed for inactivation effective 1 October 1978. They were the 34 Supply Squadron (Mobile), 34 Maintenance Squadron (Mobile) and the 1st ALC Augmentation Squadron. The missions were consolidated into a new U.S. Air Force controlled Reserve unit designated as the 402 Combat Logistics Support Squadron effective 1 October 1978.
