EMBLEM

The anemometer cups represent weather support to the four interceptors. The interceptors indicate the Air Defense Command with active missions in all directions around the dock (24-hour operations). The black and blue fields represent night and day. The emblem bears the Air Force colors, ultramarine blue and golden yellow, to indicate the squadron is a member of the USAF, The motto reflects the primary mission which is direct support of the 25th NORAD Region and the 25th Air Division (SAGE).
