OPERATIONS

Coordinated rescue and recovery resources and missions in western pacific and conducted rescue and recovery missions in western Pacific and Southeast Asia, Aug 1961-Aug 1975.

15 Apr-19 Apr 1969 Rescue units of the 41 ARR Wing responded within minutes after notification that a United States Navy EC-121 had gone down in the Sea of Japan about 50 miles from the North Korean coast. ARRS forces flew 33 sorties and 399 flying hours in an effort to locate survivors. On 17 April a United States destroyer recovered two bodies, identified as crewmen from the EC-121. The mission was suspended on 19 April.

Provided air recovery and search support for NASA manned space flights, including the Apollo missions, the last being Apollo 17 in the fall of 1972.

The mission changed in Sep 1975 to worldwide search, rescue and recovery, with the addition of weather reconnaissance, including flying into typhoons, until 1989.
