

## 7 LOGISTICS READINESS SQUADRON



### MISSION

The 7th Logistics Readiness Squadron provides home-base logistics support as well as mobility support of deployed forces. The unit provides supplies, equipment and fuel to all base units, receiving and storing more than 388,000 pieces of property valued at more than \$211 million. They fulfill the base's transportation requirements, managing and maintaining 588 vehicles, operation of the base taxi fleet, aircrew transportation, personal property shipments and recalling and training ready-augmentation-duty force personnel to support deployment exercises, inspections and contingencies. The unit provides more than four million gallons of aviation and ground fuels to all government vehicles and aircraft. Provides all contingency and peacetime deployment planning and execution, war reserve materiel management, base support planning and support agreement management.

## **EMBLEM**

On a disc Azure, a tower Argent (Silver Gray) of three windows one and two Sable, surmounted by a key, wards downward to dexter base Or, and a lightning bolt White in saltire; all within a border divided per border Black and Air Force Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll inscribed "VICTORIA PER PROCINCTU" in Yellow and edged with a narrow Yellow border. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll inscribed "7 LOGISTICS READINESS SQ" in Yellow letters and edged with a narrow Yellow border. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The rook represents the military troops and equipment being transferred from one organization to another. The key denotes security, safekeeping and control of materiel management in the "Quartermaster Corps" tradition. The lightning bolt represents the integrating role of contingency operations and the capacity to combine essential logistics elements into a coherent plan supporting the warfighter.
