### **MISSION**

Mission is to provide base support planning to include logistics command and control in support of the Aerospace Expeditionary Force. The flight performs logistics planning and manages all required mobility bag, small arms weapons, ammunition and war reserve materiel. 50th LRF also conducts deployment planning, training and execution. In addition, the flight manages the wing support agreements and vehicle transportation programs. Lastly, 50th LRF performs Quality Assurance and Functional Director duties for the Multi-Wing Logistics Support Acquisition and Mission Communication Operations and Maintenance Contracts.

## EMBLEM



50 Supply Squadron patch

50 Logistics Readiness Flight emblem: On a disc Azure, a pale engrailed Gules, throughout a pair of wings conjoined Or, detailed Brün, overall an arrow erect Argent, detailed Gris, all within a narrow border Blue. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "50TH LOGISTICS READINESS FLT" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The emblem is symbolic of the unit and Air Force colors. The background alludes to aerospace, the primary theater of Air Force operations, and excellence of personnel in assigned tasks. The wings open for flight refer to the unit's constant state of readiness. The arrow pointed upwards represents the unit's positive interaction with all wing organizations in the quest for logistics excellence.
