On a disc Azure, a bordure consisting of a modified film strip Argent (Silver Gray) edged and lined Sable, overall a wolf's head Argent, garnished of the second, detailed of the third, eyed Or, langued and inner ear Gules, armed of the fourth, holding in its jaw a dagger fesswise of the second, point to sinister, blade of the fourth, all edged and detailed of the third, the pommel a stylized rose of the sixth, petals of the second, edged and detailed of the third, barbed of the fifth, all within a narrow border of the fourth. Attached above the disc, a Black scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "TENEO VERUM" in Yellow letters Attached below the disc, a Black scroll edged with a narrow yellow border and inscribed "64TH INTELLIGENCE SQUADRON" in Yellow letters. SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. Red represents the courage, passion and strength of the members of the unit. The wolf's head symbolizes the unit's personnel who can operate alone or in a pack in order to complete the mission, representative of how this Reserve mission must operate. The dagger adorned with a rose barred in the wolf's jaw represents the unit's military preparedness and the human compassion necessary to complete the objectives of the mission. The rimmed film strip signifies the lineage of the unit to its early parent, the 34th Photo Lab, Bombardment Group. (Approved, 12 Jan 2015)

#### **OPERATIONS**

The 64th Intelligence Squadron was constituted 19 August 2013 and activated in the Reserve

at on 15 September 2013 and assigned to the 655 ISRG. The 64 IS was the Air Force Reserve's only vehicle for Human Intelligence (HUMINT) collection. They directly supported the National Air and Space Intelligence Center's (NASIC) Global Exploitation Group (GXA) at Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio.

In the early months of the pandemic, the 64 IS provided 1,362 total hours of support to support their active duty partner National Air and Space Intelligence Center (NASIC) with military personnel authorization (MPA) tours. Squadron members also supported U.S. Africa Command (AFRICOM) and U.S. Southern Command (USSOUTHCOM) with active duty deployments. The squadron also had a member on active duty supporting Headquarter Air Force Intelligence (HQ AF/A2).

Squadron members supporting HQ AF developed policy and guidance, enabling security, and the conduction of training. Like many unit in the 655 ISRW, the 64 IS provided direct support to units other than its classic associate unit when called upon to do so. For example, the 64 IS also supported 12 Air Force (Air Forces Southern) directly by providing Human Intelligence (HUMIT) support.
