EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, issuing from sinister chief, a lightning bolt Or, the point ending at a demi-sphere issuing from base of the first gridlined and edged Argent, overall issuing from dexter a fox Gold Brown, detailed Sable, garnished of the third, eyed of the second, its dexter paw upon the sphere, holding in its mouth a key fesswise Argent (Silver Gray), ward to dexter and downwards, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached below the disc, a Black scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "71st INTELLIGENCE SQUADRON" in Yellow letters. Attached above the disc, a Black scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "NULLUS ASYLUM" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE**: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The fox represents the cunning of the unit's members and the hunt for targets, while carrying the key represents the unit's devotion to the mission and their existence as an intelligence squadron. The lightning bolt symbolizes the need for swift and decisive approaches towards meeting the intelligence demands which arise all across the globe. (Approved, 25 Nov 2014)

OPERATIONS

The 71 Intelligence Squadron was activated 24 January 1955 as the 71st Reconnaissance Technical Squadron at Larson AFB, Washington as part of the 71st Strategic Reconnaissance Wing. It remained active until 01 July 1957 when it was inactivated at Larson AFB along with the rest of the 71 SRW. While still inactive, it was redesignated as the 71st Intelligence Squadron on 19 August 2013 and then activated in the Reserve at Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio on 15 September 2013. They maintained a Classic Association Partnership with the National Air and Space Intelligence Center's Geospatial and Signal Intelligence Group (NASIC/GS).
