EMBLEM

On a disc Reflex Blue and cross Flame Red, overall a stylized caduceus; all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Reflex Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "PLEBUM PASSION PROFECTUM" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Reflex Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "72D HEALTHCARE OPERATIONS SQ" in Yellow letters. SIGNIFICANCE. Reflex blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The caduceus, associated with the Greek god Hermes, the emissary and messenger of the gods, symbolizes the elements of humanity basic to both healthcare and military operations, such as translation of messages received into actionable efforts of improvement and interpersonal negotiation and wisdom required in such efforts. The flame red cross on reflex blue the field of the disc represents the magnanimity of military medical services, providing assistance without discrimination, preventing and relieving human suffering, and protecting life and health while ensuring dignity and respect for all. "PLEBUM PASSION PROFECTUM", inscribed in the scroll above the disc, reflects the Squadron's vision focus on the betterment of bother personnel and patients, passionate pursuit of better, safer, smarter, more efficient, and more cost effective efforts, and striving to always progress and improve.
