In simple terms the mission of the 7330th Pilot Training Group (MDAP) is to provide formal academic and flying training for students from Mutual Defense Assistance Program (MDAP) countries.

This organization has trained students from the following MDAP countries: Spain, Portugal, Italy, Turkey, Greece, Norway, France, Belgium, United Kingdom, Netherlands, Pakistan, Denmark, Iran, and Yugoslavia.

All of the students arriving for training are rated pilots in the countries from which they come. They are trained in the T-33 American Jet Airplane. Some of the students are entered in more than one of the several courses-offered. Students receive transition, instrument or instructor flying training, supplemented by a well planned academic program along with synthetic instrument training. Great emphasis is placed upon flying safety and standardization of air and ground procedures.

The basic mission of the 7330th Pilot Training Group (MDAP) has not changed since it was activated two years ago. The great success enjoyed by the organization in accomplishing its mission cannot be better summarized than the often repeated statement made by course graduates, "the training was excellent, the experience was wonderful".
