OPERATIONS

On 16 July 1962 the 7122d Tactical Wing turned a much improved air base over to the 7367th Combat Support Group and departed Chambley.

On 15 October 1966 USAFE inactivated the 25th Tactical Reconnaissance Wing at Chambley as part of FRELOC and again activated the 7367th Combat Support Group to close the base. On the same date Chambley changed from a main operating base to a standby operating base. The 7367th immediately began to pack and ship all U.S. property off base. Chambley's value as of August 1966 was \$14,247,396.07. The NATO property account was slightly over \$15 million. These numbers include all structures and other real property, but do not include aircraft or spare aircraft parts. Chambley was transferred to the Liquidation Office in Paris and deleted

from USAF property records in March 1967. On 1 April 1967 USAFE discontinued the 7367th Combat Support Group as part of FRELOC and the last USAF airplane, a T-33, departed Chambley for West Germany.
