EMBLEM

On a disc divided horizontally three fourths blue above green, a white eagle, beak and talons yellow detailed scarlet, grasping a green globe grid lined yellow at an axis tipped 10 degrees from upper left to lower right between two yellow forklifts detailed black in perspective and charged on its breast with a shield blazoned: gules six pallets argent on a chief azure five mullets of the second; all within a narrow yellow border. Attached above the disc a blue scroll edged with a narrow yellow border. Attached below the disc a blue scroll inscribed DEDICATED TO SERVE in yellow letters and edged with a narrow yellow border.

SIGNIFICANCE: Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The forklifts signify the mission of the unit. The globe indicates worldwide service. The eagle reflects military preparedness. (Approved, 13 Feb 1989)
