Azure, in sinister chief an eagle's head erased Proper above three conjoined contrails issuing from sinister and arcing to dexter chief below three flight symbols ascending bendwise sinister in bendwise sinister Argent, overall in dexter base a sword point to base of the last hilt Gules garnished Sable, winged Or, garnished of the fourth; all within a diminished bordure of the last. Attached below the disc, a Silver scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "ACC INSPECTION SQ" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The winged sword taken from the unit's parent

organization represents the power of the command and the unit's contribution. The eagle with its keen eyesight symbolizes personnel of the unit and their commitment of overseeing the command to ensure that combat capability is maintained. The flight symbols suggest the main functions of the command and reflect the main functions of the Squadron to motivate, educate and independently evaluate.
