## **EMBLEM**

Azure, the Liberty Bell bronze above and enveloped by two wings elevated and displayed or surmounted by a hurt rimmed argent and charged with a mullet of the like, all within a diminished bordure of the third. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The background of the Air Force blue symbolizes the broad aerospace mission of the Air Force Reserve, including all facets of assigned organizations, whether operational or support. The combination of the Air Force blue and gold establishes Eastern Air Force Reserve as part of the United States Aerospace Team. The Liberty Bell is symbolic of the dedication, devotion, and foresight of the founding fathers of this country in their quest for freedom. It represents the self-sacrifice of the early American citizen-soldier and the pursuit of freedom of choice, liberty and self-administration. The Bell is symbolic of the freedoms established for, and represented by, the United States. The wings represent the modern Air Force Reserve and its instant readiness to protect the rights symbolized by the Liberty Bell. Further, it identifies the relationship of the Eastern Air Force Reserve Region to its parent organization, the Air Force Reserve. The placing of the Liberty Bell within the wings is intended to reflect the support of the Eastern Air Force Reserve Region in the total national defense effort and the freedoms represented by the Liberty Bell.
